9. COURSE REQUIREMENT

9.1. Rules of class participation

- Students are responsible for attending all classes. In case of absence from school due to force majeure reasons, there must be sufficient and reasonable proofs.
- Students are responsible for actively researching documents, proactively preparing lessons before going to class according to the instructions and requests of lecturers.
- Students who absent more than 20% of the lessons of the subject will be considered as incomplete the course and have to enroll again.
- Students who submit individual and group assignments later than the deadline given by the instructors will receive a score of 0 for that assignment.

- Regarding the discussion between lecturers and students: Encourage students to participate in discussions (groups and individuals), give direct feedback to teachers about the content of the module, teaching and learning methods, teaching materials. Lecturers also encourage students to give feedback about the forms, methods and contents of the tests, and final study evaluation. Students can communicate with lecturers in class, during office hours or via email. The valuable student feedback contributes to improve the teaching and learning quality of the module.

9.2. Rules of classroom behavior

- The module is conducted on the principle of respect for learners and teachers. All acts that interfere with the teaching and learning process are strictly prohibited.
- Students need to actively participate in lectures in class through discussions with teachers (answer and ask questions) and group discussions, presentations
- Students must go to school on time. Students who are late more than 10 minutes after class starts will not be able to attend the class.
